Health Insurance Options

- COBRA

- Federal mandated law
- Allows you to continue on current employer health, dental, vision plan
- o Employee responsible for 102% cost of plan
- 60-day enrollment window
- Washington Healthplanfinder (WA's health insurance marketplace)
 - May qualify for subsidies (savings) or Medicaid.
 - 60-day special enrollment window
- Spouse's or Parent's Health Plan
 - 30-day special enrollment window

Background Information

- Washington Health Benefit Exchange operates the online health insurance marketplace <u>Washington Healthplanfinder</u>
- Over 2 million –1 out of every 4 Washingtonians use <u>Washington</u> <u>Healthplanfinder</u> to access high-quality health and dental insurance

 - ▶ Search for and enroll in a plan that meets your needs
 - ► Get access to federal tax credits and Cascade Care Savings (state subsidy)
 - Sign up for Washington Apple Health (Medicaid)

How Much Does Coverage Through Washington Healthplanfinder Cost?

- Washington Apple Health (Medicaid) is free or low-cost
 *Over 1.5M people are enrolled in Washington Apple Health
- Qualified Health Plan & Qualified Dental Plan prices vary based primarily on age, household income and county

Federal and state subsidies are available <u>exclusively</u> through *Washington Healthplanfinder*, which lower your monthly cost.

When Can I Sign Up?

- Washington Apple Health (Medicaid) is available year-round
- Qualified Health Plan & Qualified Dental Plan coverage is available:
 - 1. During Fall "open enrollment" period (Nov. 1 Jan. 15, for 2025 coverage)
 - 2. Outside of open enrollment if you experience a "qualifying event" (such as loss of employer coverage; expiration of COBRA; change in household size)
 - ► You typically have 60 days before/after the date of the qualifying event to enroll



Reporting Income

What Income do I Report?

Your taxable income including income for any household members that are your tax dependents.

How Can I Report My Income?

Point-in-Time Income

Report income that is received or likely to be received in the month you apply for coverage.

Anticipated Yearly Income

Report all prior received and anticipated income for the current year.

Strikes and Labor Disputes

- A labor dispute is a strike or lockout.
- Striking workers generally are not eligible for unemployment benefits. We determine eligibility for unemployment benefits on a case-by-case basis for workers in a labor dispute.

Benefits

Strikes and Labor Disputes

- You may be eligible for unemployment benefits if:
- You are locked out by your employer or laid off due to lack of work because of the strike,
- If you quit your job during the labor dispute,
- If you are fired during the labor dispute, or
- If you are replaced during the labor dispute

Paid Family and Medical Leave (PFML)

- You are eligible for PFML after working 820 hours in your qualifying period (about the 12-month period preceding leave) and after having experienced a qualifying event.
- Available when a serious health condition prevents you from working or when you need time to care for a family member, bond with a new child, or spend time with a family member preparing for military service overseas.
- If you are approved for PFML, it will continue during the duration of the qualifying event, regardless of the strike.



UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (UI)

MANY MEMBERS HAVE QUESTIONS REGARDING WASHINGTON STATE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (UI). WHILE EACH CLAIM IS ASSESSED INDIVIDUALLY, IT'S IMPORTANT TO KNOW THAT 751 MEMBERS APPLYING FOR AND RECEIVING UI BENEFITS DURING THE STRIKE MAY HAVE TO PAY IT BACK LATER. WASHINGTON STATE GENERALLY DOES NOT GRANT UI BENEFITS TO STRIKING WORKERS, ONLY TO THOSE LOCKED OUT BY THEIR EMPLOYERS. AS IAM 751 MEMBERS ARE ON STRIKE AND NOT LOCKED OUT, THE STATE'S SYSTEM TYPICALLY FLAGS SUCH CLAIMS AND DENIES PAYMENT WHILE THE CLAIM IS BEING REVIEWED. EVEN IF AN INITIAL CLAIM IS ACCEPTED, IT'S POSSIBLE NO PAYMENT WILL BE ISSUED.

THEREFORE, YOUR UNION ADVISES MEMBERS NOT TO APPLY FOR UI BENEFITS UNLESS THEY ARE PREPARED FOR THE POSSIBILITY OF REPAYING THE MONEY.
